



Kindergarten Learning from Home Activities

Week beginning: 8th June 2020

Daily Maths Tasks

- Continue to look at the calendar and sing the days of the week song from the previous week, talking about the day today, yesterday and tomorrow.
- Continue watching <u>Numberblocks</u> in order. Talk about what happened in the episode. (What numbers did we learn about? Can you show me that many fingers? etc)
- Continue with the 'Number of the Day' from the previous week. How many different ways can you show that number? Counting out pieces of lego/objects/ writing the number/using tally/fingers etc. Practise counting out that number of objects, saying one number name for each object and then putting them in a line to touch count them and check.
- Encourage your child to <u>count the body of the caterpillar</u> and have a go at writing the number. If you are unable to print, you could draw it!
- <u>Count the foods</u> that the very hungry caterpillar eats through and put them into the correct order.
- Put the numbers 1-10 back into the correct order.
- Write or stick the <u>number that is missing</u> onto the caterpillar.
- Practise counting confidently upto 20 with these songs.
 <u>Let's count to 20.</u>
 <u>Count with me.</u>

Daily English Tasks

Reading

- Every day spend at least 15 minutes reading together. This could be you reading a story/magazine/information book to your child or your child telling you a story from pictures in a book or a story from our talk for writing memory joggers available on the <u>school website</u>. Talk about new words or more difficult words you think your child might not know the meaning of.
- Monday, read through Poem of the Week (this can be found on the school's Twitter page – link is <u>here</u>). Help your child to learn the Kindergarten nursery rhyme off by heart, if they don't already know it. Maybe you could film them performing it and send it to a member of staff or family member to brighten their day!
- Share the story, '<u>Everybody Worries'</u> Encourage your child to talk about their worries and what they can do to help themselves feel better. There are ideas that you can practise together.

Writing

 Listen to the story, <u>'The Very Hungry Caterpillar</u>.' Children can draw their own memory jogger and retell the story. Film them being a storyteller. You may wish to send it to a member of staff!

Phonics

• Practise these <u>letter sounds</u> this week. Recap the <u>previous</u>. Be sure to pronounce them exactly as they do in the video! You can also view this <u>pronunciation video</u> included on our website. Can you find other objects around the house or out and about beginning with these sounds?
