Daily Maths Tasks

- Every day, please ensure your child accesses <u>DoodleMaths</u>. We check this throughout the week to monitor how individuals are progressing and to set specific 'added extra' tasks for pupils to complete. Please ensure your child also logs into <u>Numbots</u> to practise their fluency facts. Your child can access all of these programmes with their school logins.

The site has been backed by the government and has been created to support families with home learning during the coronavirus lockdown.

Phonics

- Monday read through Poem of the Week (this can be found on the school's Twitter page – link is here). Have a go at learning the poem throughout the week, then perform it to your family. They could maybe record you and email it to us.
- Read the extract of <u>Hungry Babies</u> with an adult, as some words might be a bit tricky. The extract includes some rhyming words, how many different words can you think of that rhyme. You might need to set up a username and password to access it.
